The Inductive Bible Study Method

I. Read the text multiple times

- II. **Observation –** What do I see in the text?
 - The 5 W's (Who, What, Where, When, Why)
 - Other key observations:
 - Repeated words or phrases
 - Anything that can be put into a list
 - Words that indicate a change in topic or theme
 - Contrasts
 - o Cause and effect words
 - You are simply making observations of the text. Don't add anything that isn't there.
- III. Interpretation What does this text mean in its context? What is the author's intended meaning?
 - Questions to ask:
 - What is the cultural and/or historical context of this passage?
 - What else do I know about the book, author, and broader context of the passage?
 - Are there other Scripture that might help me interpret this?
 - o Have I overlooked anything or made any assumptions?
 - What is the clearest meaning of this text?
 - Rules to keep in mind:
 - \circ $\;$ Look for the plainest interpretation first. Don't try to overcomplicate things
 - o Scripture interprets Scripture
 - o The Bible has 1 storyline: The Gospel and God's redemptive plan for humanity
- IV. Application What can I take away from this passage today?
 - Questions to ask:
 - What does this passage show me about my own life?
 - How does the truth of this passage help me grow closer to Christ?
 - What does this show me about God?
 - Things to keep in mind:
 - The Bible is not primarily about you
 - o Not every passage/section will have something that is a direct command or action steps
 - Sometimes there may be nothing to apply to your life, but instead shows you more about God

The Temptation of Jesus
