Part 2: <u>God's Grace</u>

Grace is <u>unmerited</u> <u>favor</u>, or a <u>free</u> <u>gift</u>.

Repent: to feel <u>sorrowful</u> or <u>mournful</u> over something either <u>done</u> or left - <u>undone</u>.
