

Community Group Discussion Guide

Sharing the Gospel with Everyone

Watch the Sharing the Gospel with Everyone teaching video on thechapel.com/chapelplus. Use the Video teaching notes or interactive notes to guide your viewing.

After viewing the video, discuss the following questions with your Community Group:

1. Of the five areas people are reportedly least equipped in, which of those do you feel least equipped in? Which do you feel most equipped in?
 - What training have you had in any of these areas?
2. Spend a few moments and practice sharing the gospel with a member of your group. Try using the GOSPEL acrostic.
 - What strategies have you used for sharing the gospel previously? How do these compare to using the GOSPEL acrostic?
3. What is your life verse? Do you have it memorized? How does your life verse fit into your grace story?
4. Split up into groups of 2-3 and practice sharing your grace story. Try and share your story within 3 minutes. Give each other feedback.
5. Have you had a spiritual conversation with a non-believer recently? How did this go?
6. Who are the people in your life who are not saved? What steps are you taking to have gospel-centered conversations?
7. With whom do you find it most difficult to share the gospel with (examples: Family, friends, neighbors, strangers)? Why?
8. Often, we may avoid having gospel-centered conversations due to fear of not having the right answers. Why should we not be afraid? How can we alleviate these fears?
9. Who can you share the gospel with this week? Commit to sharing the gospel with someone at least one time this week. Be prepared to share your experience with an accountability partner or your group.
