Sharing The Gospel Tim Stewart

**Session Overview:** Jesus' last recorded words to his disciples were, "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Therefore, go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you. And surely I am with you always, to the very end of the age" (Matt. 28: 17-20). How do we do this? Well, we start by sharing some good news with people, the Gospel.

**Key Points:** In order for people to be willing to have any type of crucial conversation, one where the repercussions of the conversation have the potential to change people's lives and relationships forever, they must first answer for themselves two questions:

## 1. Can I do it?

## 2. Is it worth it?
