Discussion Questions

- 1. Have someone in your group give a brief recap of Sunday's message, highlighting the primary Scripture points and the main idea of the message.
- 2. How did this message strengthen and/or correct your previous ideas about humanity's sin or the plan of God? Was there anything you heard for the first time or that caught your attention, challenged, or confused you? Did you learn anything new about God or yourself this week?
- 3. How does the Tower of Babel story illustrate humanity's tendency to seek independence from God?
- 4. In what ways do people today try to "make a name for themselves" similar to the people in the story?
- 5. How does God's response to the Tower of Babel demonstrate both judgment and mercy?
- Discuss the significance of God's plan to spread people across the earth despite their resistance.
- 7. How does this narrative connect to the broader biblical theme of redemption?
- 8. What action step do you need to take in response to this week's message? How can your group hold you accountable to this step?

Action Step

- 1. Reflect on areas in your life where you might be seeking self-sufficiency instead of trusting in God's plan, and pray for humility.
- 2. Commit to sharing the message of redemption in your sphere of influence, recognizing God's desire to reach people from all nations and languages.
