
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Objectives


- Lead participants into a deeper surrender to God, recognizing that mission starts with personal revival.

What is the difference between being a **“church goer”** and being a **“disciple maker”**?



Now what? What are your first steps? How do you begin fulfilling what He just commanded?

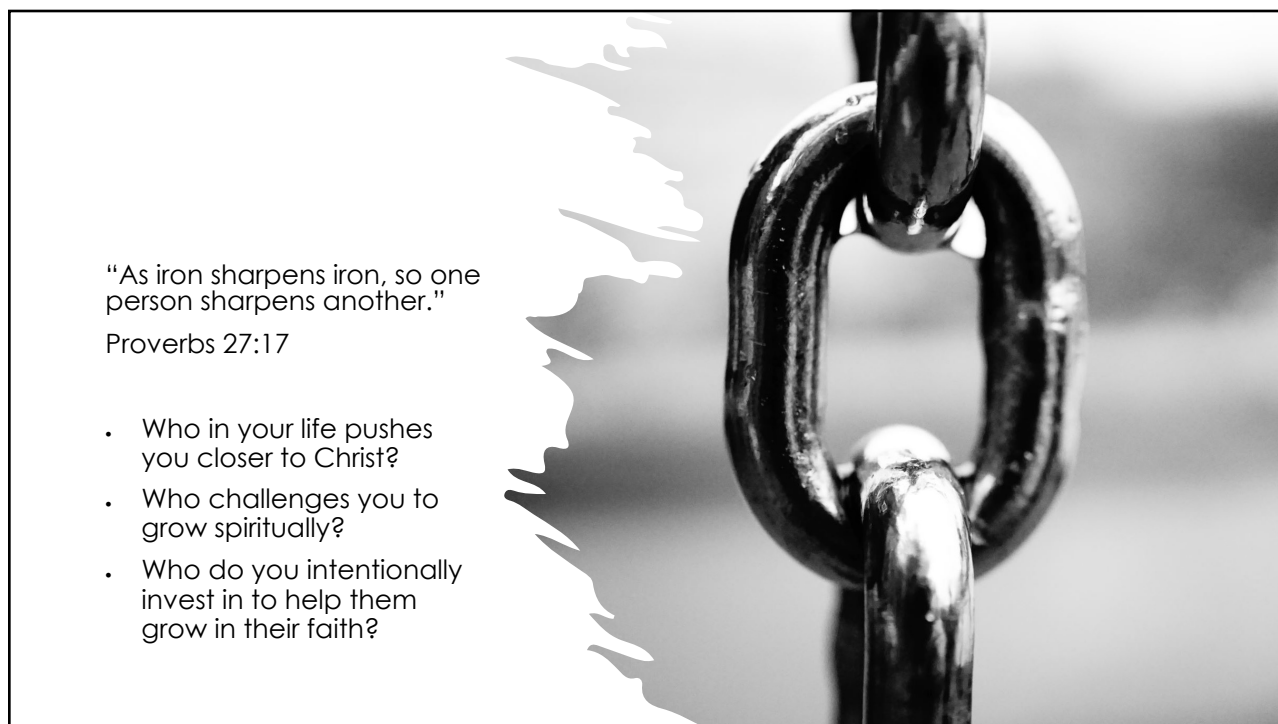
- What emotions would you feel?

Hebrews 10:24-25


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Community requires confession & accountability

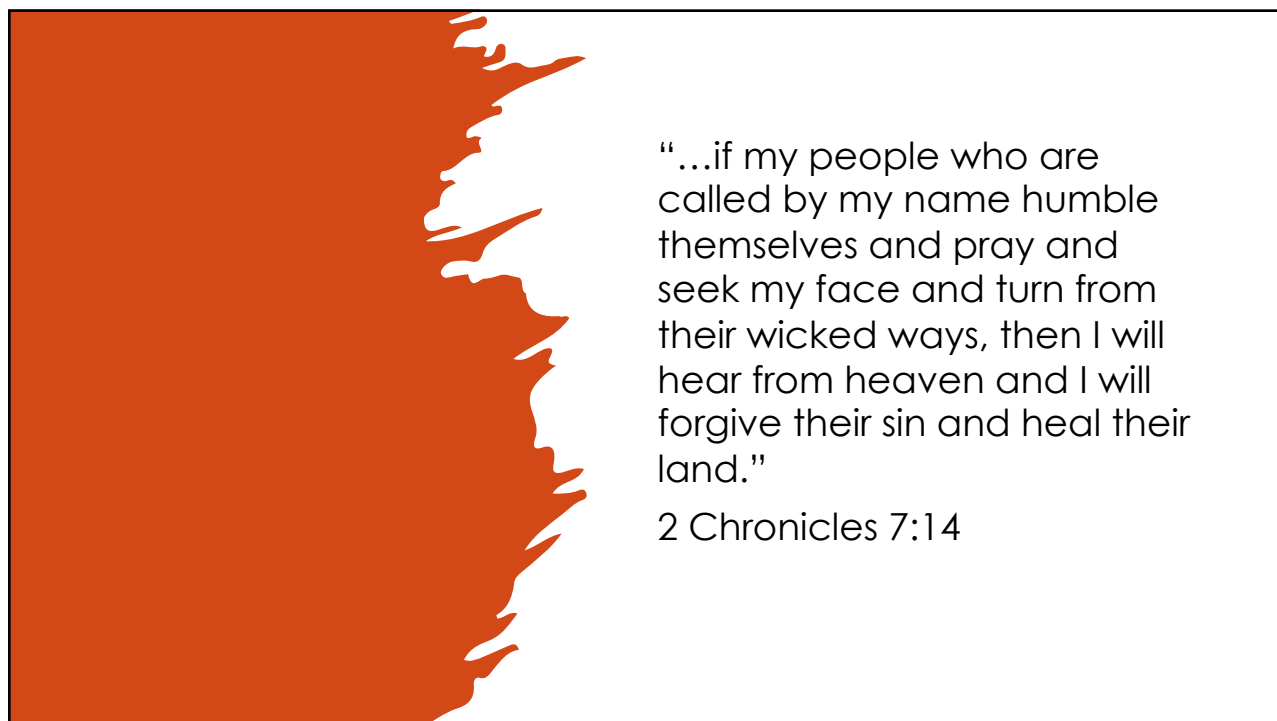
- Practice sharing your testimony with a friend

- Commit to encouraging each other to take faith-driven risks

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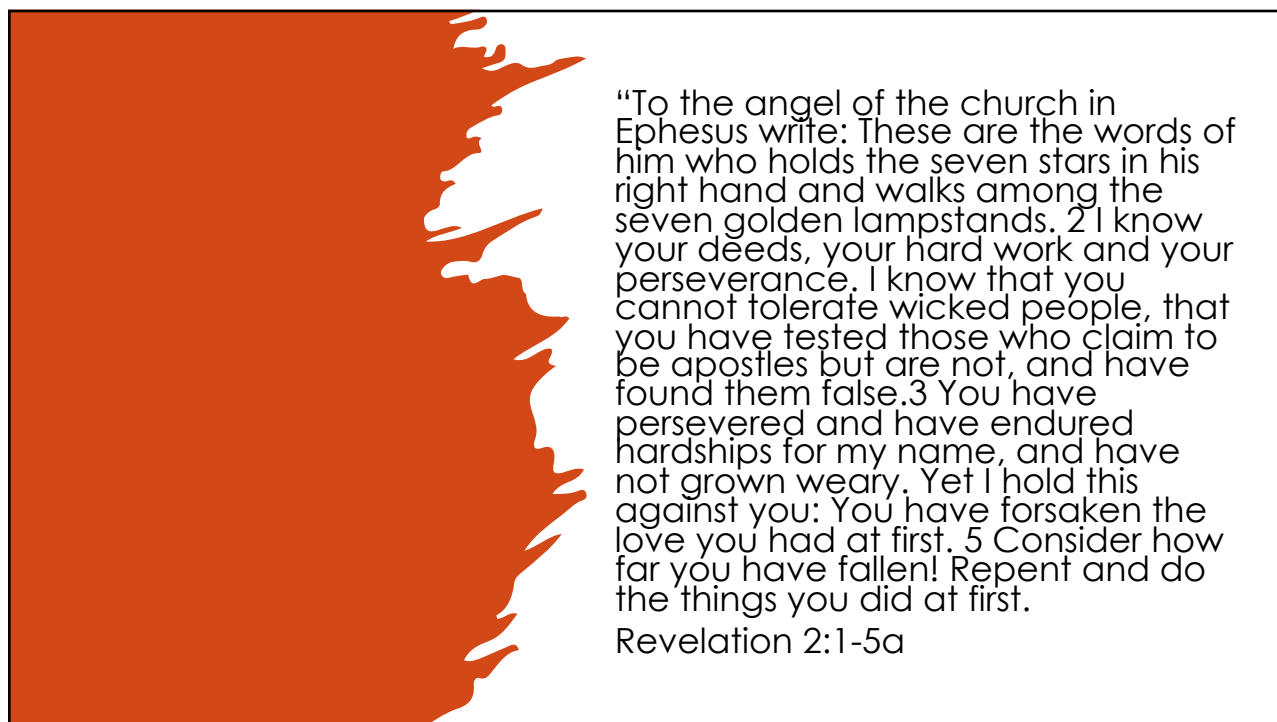

Galatians 6:2

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


**Confession

“When this became known to the Jews and Greeks living in Ephesus, they were all seized with fear, and the name of the Lord Jesus was held in high honor. Acts 19:17-20

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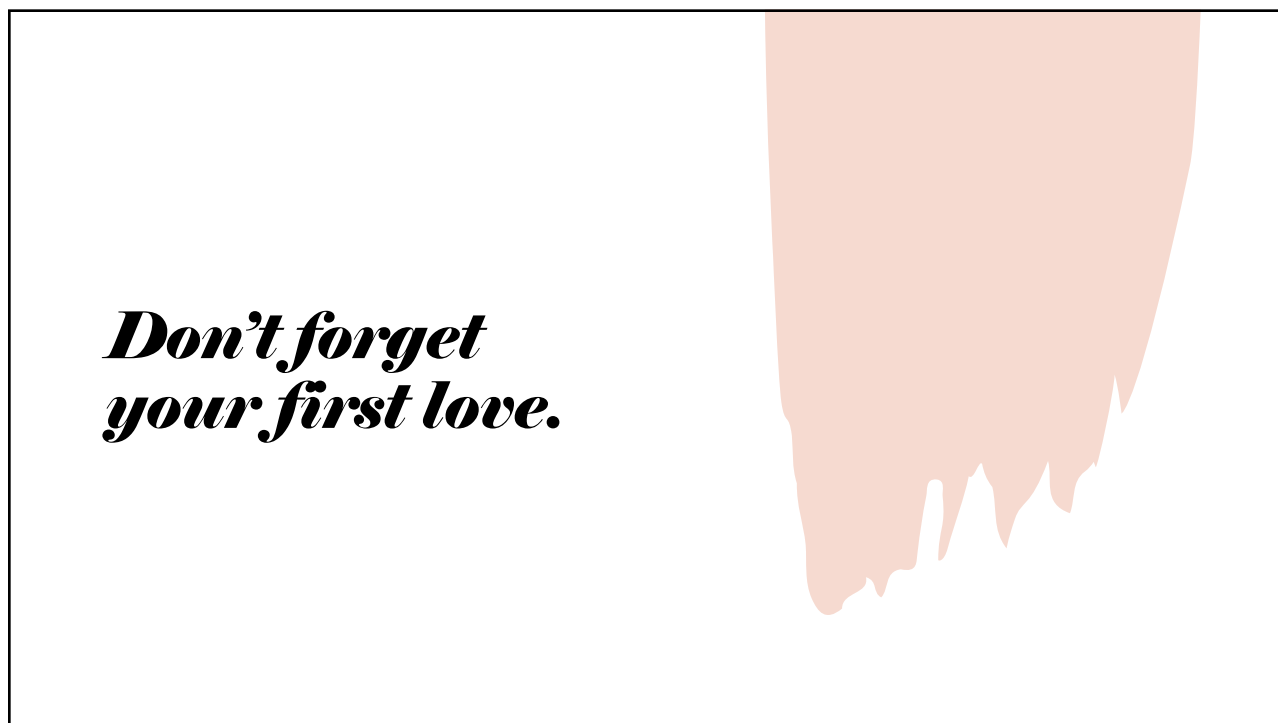


Upward fixation on Jesus
