### **Daily Readings**

**Monday:** Luke 22:14-20; Psalm 103:1-5

**Tuesday:** Luke 22:19-20; Exodus 12:1-14

**Thursday:** Matthew 26:26-28; Exodus 24:1-8

**Friday:** Luke 15:1-7; Psalm 23

**Saturday:** 1st Corinthians 11:23-26; Isaiah 25:6-9

### **Discussion Questions**

1. When you hear Jesus say, “Do this in remembrance of me,” what do you think he is inviting you to do beyond simply remembering facts about him?
2. Which theme from the message stands out most to you right now: **exodus from sin, covered debt, table fellowship, or mission**? Why?
3. What does it practically look like in your life to “set your mind on things above” (Colossians 3) in the middle of everyday distractions?
4. Where do you most struggle to believe that Jesus has fully forgiven you and brought you into his table?
5. How does communion reshape the way you see both your identity (who you are) and your responsibility (what you are sent to do)?

### **Action Steps**

1. Each morning this week, take 2–3 minutes before anything else to pray, “Jesus, re-center my mind on You,” and read a short portion of the daily readings.
2. Throughout your week, practice “table awareness” by intentionally slowing down, listening well, and extending welcome and inclusion to the people you interact with.

3. Take time this week to identify one area where you still feel spiritual “debt,” and pray specifically, “Jesus, I believe You have covered this,” choosing not to carry that weight anymore.
